Use only a pencil.</p> </div> <hr/> <p align="center">Constitutional Amendments</p> <hr/> <p>The following amendments to the state Constitution are submitted to the voters by initiative or by the Legislature. The amendments will not become effective unless approved by majority vote.</p> <hr/> <p align="center">Constitutional Amendment A</p> <hr/> <p>Title: An amendment to Article VI, Section 7 of the Constitution, relating to the rights of a criminal defendant.</p> <p>Attorney General Explanation: The Constitution currently guarantees certain rights to a person accused of a crime. Amendment A would amend the Constitution to state that a criminal defendant may argue the merits, validity, and applicability of the law, including sentencing laws.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES A vote "Yes" will change the Constitution.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> NO A vote "No" will leave the Constitution as it is.</p> <p align="center">Go to top of next column</p>	<hr/> <p align="center">Constitutional Amendment B</p> <hr/> <p>Title: An amendment to Article III, Section 5 of the Constitution to clarify the responsibility of the Legislature to provide for its own apportionment.</p> <p>Attorney General Explanation: The Constitution requires the Legislature to establish legislative districts every ten years. Voters from each legislative district elect one state senator and one or two state representatives to the South Dakota Legislature. Amendment B would require the Legislature to adopt a new plan, in a regular or special legislative session, if a court invalidates the districts established by the Legislature.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES A vote "Yes" would change the Constitution.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> NO A vote "No" would leave the Constitution as it is.</p> <hr/> <p align="center">Constitutional Amendment C</p> <hr/> <p>Title: An amendment to Article IV, Section 4 of the Constitution, extending the time allowed for the Governor's review of legislation passed by the Legislature.</p> <p>Attorney General Explanation: The Governor must veto legislation within five days of presentation while the Legislature is in session, and within fifteen days of presentation if presented within five days of adjournment or recess. This initiated measure will not become effective unless approved by majority vote.</p> <hr/> <p align="center">Initiated Measure 1</p> <hr/> <p>Title: An initiated measure adopting a law relating to industrial hemp (cannabis).</p> <p>Attorney General Explanation: Initiated Measure 1 proposes a law that would make it legal under state law, but not under federal law, for a person to plant, cultivate, harvest, possess, process, transport, sell or buy industrial hemp (cannabis) or any of its by-products with a tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) content of one percent or less.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES A vote "Yes" would adopt the state law.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> NO A vote "No" would leave state law as it is.</p>
